The Energy Journal

CONFERENCES

IAEE Conferences attract delegates from the most influential government, corporate and academic energy decision-making institutions. Conference programs address critical issues of vital concern and importance to governments and industries and provide a forum where policy issues are presented, considered and discussed at both formal sessions and informal social functions.

IAEE typically holds four Conferences each year.

- **International Conference.** This meeting is hosted by an active Affiliate of the Association. Recent meetings have been held in Potsdam, Taiwan, Prague, Aberdeen, Houston, Wellington and Istanbul.
- **North American Conference.** This meeting is hosted by the United States Association for Energy Economics. Recent meetings have been held in Ann Arbor, Denver, Washington, Mexico City, Vancouver and New Orleans.
- **European Conference.** This meeting is hosted by an active European Affiliate of the Association. Recent meetings have been held in Bergen, Zurich, Paris and Berlin.
- **Asian Conference.** This meeting is hosted by an active Asian Affiliate of the Association. Recent meetings have been held in Taipei and Perth.

These Conferences provide a cost-effective and pleasurable opportunity to keep up-to-date on current issues and topics that will shape the industry in coming years. Keynote and luncheon speakers are well-known authorities that draw a wide audience at all IAEE Conferences.

General sessions also attract leading industry specialists who discuss and debate how trends and policies will effect the industry. Further, every international conference has at least 20 concurrent sessions where members may submit their current research and present their findings to conference delegates. Concurrent sessions emphasize all facets of the energy industries.

IAEE members regularly receive conference and registration announcements regarding the Association's meetings. IAEE members normally attend IAEE endorsed conferences at reduced rates.

PROCEEDINGS

IAEE conferences publish proceedings from the papers presented at the meeting. IAEE Conference Proceedings have gained wide spread acclaim from the membership as they include the most current articles on energy issues effecting the industry. Proceedings of most IAEE conferences are available for those members unable to attend the conference.

MEMBERSHIP

How to Become a Member

Any person with an active interest in energy economics is eligible for membership in the Association. IAEE may be joined as a Direct member, through a local Affiliate, or as an Institutional member. Student memberships are also available. Currently, approximately 55% are members through their Affiliate and 45% are Direct and Institutional members.

DIRECT MEMBERSHIP

Individuals may join the Association directly. Direct memberships are \$80 per year and include a subscription to *The Energy Journal* and the *IAEE Energy Forum*. The Association will bill direct members annually for renewal dues. Direct memberships run twelve months from the date of receipt of a new member's dues. In some instances, as with U.S. members, the Association remits a portion of the dues payment to the local Affiliate to cover its dues.

MEMBERSHIP THROUGH AN AFFILIATE

Individuals may join the Association through a local Affiliate by indicating to the Affiliate that they wish to join the IAEE. The local Affiliate will collect the dues and forward them to Headquarters to establish membership. Annually Headquarters bills the Affiliate for the renewal dues of its IAEE members. Affiliates usually add an amount to cover local dues to the IAEE membership dues which are \$70. Membership through an Affiliate is on a calendar year basis.

MEMBERSHIP IN THE UNITED STATES ASSOCIATION FOR ENERGY ECONOMICS (USAEE)

Membership in the USAEE is automatically combined with membership in the IAEE. The combined dues are \$100.

STUDENT MEMBERSHIP

Student memberships are also available to any full-time student (as defined by being registered for 15 or more credit hours per semester and not employed full-time), either graduate or undergraduate at an institution of higher learning.
