Dear Energy Professional,

We are pleased to invite you to the 26th Annual IAEE International Conference to be held in Prague, Czech Republic, June 4-7, 2003. The program committee has been very busy putting together a program that is sure to address a multitude of energy topics. Recent political events are effecting the future of important energy producing countries of the Middle East. The enlargement of the European Union and its search for security of energy supply as well as the collapse of several major trading companies all present a major challenge to energy decision-makers. Other important issues such as new technologies in energy production, the role of governments and markets in shaping energy and environmental policies will also be addressed at the Prague IAEE International Conference.

The primary purpose of this program announcement is to bring forward the conferences' Call for Papers. Note that the deadline for Abstracts is December 31, 2002. We have developed five energy tracks (Liberalization & Energy Markets, Energy Policy and Economics of Ethics, Oil & Natural Gas, New Technology & Energy Efficiency and Environmental Issues) that we request you fit your paper into. When submitting your abstract YOU MUST indicate which track your paper will fit. Given the success of the poster session at the Aberdeen IAEE International Conference, we will continue to offer this alternative speaking approach in Prague. As such, papers that do not fit into concurrent sessions will be allocated to poster sessions; henceforth, the importance of mentioning which energy track listed above your paper will fit.

Eight organized plenary sessions, 25 concurrent sessions and 4 poster sessions will be offered to conference delegates. Given the location of the meeting in Prague, we anticipate an even larger draw to our concurrent and poster sessions.

Prague is an attractive location, rich in culture and social activities. Single/double nights at the Dorint Don Giovanni Hotel are US \$133.00 per night. You must make your hotel reservations by completing the enclosed Hotel Booking Form and either emailing or faxing this direct to the Dorint Hotel. IAEE is pleased to offer an award for the Best Student Paper on energy economics in 2003. The award will consist of a \$1000.00 cash prize plus waiver of conference registration fees. To be considered for the IAEE Best Student Paper Award please follow the below guidelines.

- Student must be a member of IAEE in good standing.
- Submit COMPLETE paper by February 14, 2003 to IAEE Headquarters.
- Paper MUST be original work by the student (at least 50% of work completed by the student seeking award).
- Submit a letter stating that you are a full-time student and are not employed full-time. The letter should briefly describe your energy interests and tell what you hope to accomplish by attending the conference. The letter should also provide the name and contact information of your main faculty supervisor or your department chair. Please also, include a copy of your student identification card.
- Submit a brief letter from a faculty member, preferably your main faculty supervisor, indicating your research interests, the nature of your academic program, and your academic progress. The faculty member should state whether he or she recommends that you be granted the IAEE Best Student Paper Award in 2003.

Complete applications should be submitted to the IAEE Headquarters office no later than February 14, 2003 for consideration.

AIR TRANSPORTATION

GROUND TRANSPORTATION

A good metro system, as well as trams and buses serve the city and its suburbs. Metro and tramlines crisscross the city in all directions, while buses generally serve suburban areas, often running from metro station to areas between and beyond metro lines. Tickets can be purchased in metro stations and in newsstands, but not on board a bus or tram. A special deal has been negotiated for the conference delegates. For approximately US\$2.00, delegates can obtain a 4-day pass valid for all modes of public transportation – an excellent value! Hotel DORINT Don Giovanni is conveniently located just above the metro station ZELIVSKÉHO, four metro stops from the city center. It takes about 10 minutes to get to downtown. Also, the tram station is located nearby. Basically, no taxi or car rental is necessary in Prague, except for the period between midnight and 5am, when the metro does not run. During this period, only tram and buses are available.

Transport from the airport to the hotel: A subsidiary of Czech Airlines, AIRTOURS will provide a shuttle bus between the airport and hotel for selected CSA flights on June 4, 2003. Otherwise, taxis can be hired at the airport. The trip to the Hotel DORINT is approximately US\$20.00.

DISCOVER PRAGUE

Prague or "The Mother of Cities" is steeped in treasures both past and present. In the heart of the historical Bohemian region of central Europe, visitors are treated to history at every turn; the Jewish quarter, the National Gallery, Old Town Square, Charles Bridge, Wenceslas Square and the Lesser Quarter. There is no limit to the amount of history bestowed upon the towers of The Prague Castle and St. Vitus Cathedral. The Czech Republic's capital city is located on the Vltava (Moldau) River. Prague offers the traveler a view of all the major architectural styles of Western European history. Prague's buildings are well pre-served, as they have been relatively free of major wars.

Be sure to leave a few days both pre and post of the conference to allow for time to take in all that Prague has to offer. Walk the Royal Route: Prague Castle (containing walls more than a millennium old and current seat of the Czech president). Within the walls of Prague Castle you can visit St. Vitus Cathedral, the Royal Palace and St. George's Basilica, which is now an art gallery. Before leaving the castle, wander through Golden Lane, an alley of 16 tiny houses built along a former castle wall named for the goldsmiths once employed by the Emperor.

Stroll across Charles Bridge built in the mid-14th century by Charles IV. The bridge is open to pedestrians only. Take your time to enjoy the view and discover the significance of the monarch's use of astrologers to time the building of the bridge to be at the most appropriate time. Speaking of time, just over the bridge, in Old Town Square, you'll find the astronomical clock with performances at the top of each hour depicting the march of the twelve apostles. Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart walked the streets of Old Town and conducted the premiere of *Don Giovanni* within its borders.

If all your touring hasn't left you exhausted, you can find some good buys while shopping. Blood-red garnets are the official Czech national gem, fine crystal has been produced in Bohemia since the 14th century, antiques including books and prints are readily available, local beer is a bit heavy to carry home, but you can take home a taste of Prague with Becherovka, the country's popular herbal liqueur.

Prague has a tradition for theater. Prague's leading theaters include: the National Theatre, the State Opera, the Estates' Theatre and the Magic Lantern. You can choose between many performances such as dance, drama, music or a musical. Wherever you choose, you can be sure that you are sitting where history was made.

CLIMATE
