- 4. A short statement (max 1 page) describing your vision for the future of *The Energy Journal* and how it should serve its readers.
- 5. A sample of recently published peer-reviewed work.

The deadline for applications is 5pm CET on 1 September 2023. We consider candidates without regard to race, sex, color, creed, religion, age, national origin or sexual orientation.
